Conviction of Forgery; Sentence: 10 yrs

Bank v State 208 SW 509 - State Concurrent with Military

✓ D.O. of JAG 1912-1940 See Sec 451 p 319, Forgery
JAG, in discussing Forgery of a Pass, held

that "Forgery of a pass may be forgery at Common-law. The in-
tent to defraud, however, is an essential element of the crime of
forgery, and a specification that the accused did, "with intent to
deceive" forge a certain pass, does not charge a felony."
