I certify that Loc. Paly is an Appa-
lachicola - Indian. belonging to Echon
Chatta Mico town - that he has enrolled
for migration to the Country set apart
for said Indians west of the Meris
upper Run and claiming to be the owner
of a certain improvement on the re-
novation of said Indians relinquish-
ed to the United States - which I have
valued as follows - One Cabin fifteen
dollars; one store house - ten dollars
one barn five dollars one fence
and twenty fruit trees nine dollars one
small house five dollars - and one
hundred and twenty two acres
land. One thousand and thirty two
dollars making in all eleven hundred
and one dollar which sum he
will be entitled to receive on emi-
gration and arrival at Fort Gibson
and presenting this Certificate in person
to the disbursing officer for the Dept
of Ind. Affrs - for the Creek Indians
or such part thereof as will be
by properties of fifteen thousand do-
llars four hundred dollars stipulated
to be paid for improvement in the
2^d article treaty with the Seminoles at
Ragun. Land on 9th May 1832 - This
Certificate is not transferable and no pay-
ment will be made to any purchaser or
assignee.
