permission granted from Indian  
Bureau & forwarded through you.  
In leaving at this time, I am  
happy to be able to report every  
thing going on properly in my  
Sub-agency - the hunting parties have  
left for the prairies and will return  
about 1<sup>st</sup> March until which time  
they requested (thro' their authorities)  
that the Armenties be should be  
retained in the hands of the Govt  
Agent - & up to which time there  
will be almost a total cessation  
of business.
