I regret that it becomes my duty to inform you that citizens of the United States are settling in the Cherokee Nation in defiance of law, particularly in that part called the Neutral Land - therefore it will be necessary for me to remove them, and I would like for the military at Fort Gibson to be instructed by the Secy. of War to cooperate with me for that purpose.
