I was satisfied he really had no valid
claim to having ransomed the Wilson boys;
and the compromise was made with him by
Brown & Hampshire (both citizens of the Commonwealth)
merely to remove an obstacle to a speedy
settlement - both of them protesting that "Popom"
was really entitled to nothing but was merely
in company & therefore set up his claim to part
of the ransom.
