

Office Supr. Ina affair  
Fort Smith September 6<sup>th</sup> 1859.

Sir,

Referring to Tabular Statement of funds  
remitted to you for the Superintendency, for 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>d</sup>  
quarters of 1859. For the stocks agency, for  
fulfilling treaties with Indians, I find there  
was remitted, as follows.

Blacksmiths assistance, shops stock & provisions,  
during the pleasure of the President 3<sup>d</sup> art Treaty, 18<sup>th</sup>  
May 1859, \$1060 - 1/2 year ————— \$560 00,  
which is \$30- more than ever was for the 1/2 year.

By Tabular Statement for same tribe for 3<sup>d</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup>  
quar I find in addition to the \$530- for Blacksmith  
&c &c for the half year, the sum of \$300. Pay of  
Furnace during the pleasure of the President, for 1/2 year.

The \$300- Pay of Furnace for 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>d</sup> quarters not  
being sent out, it is still due to the tribe, to all  
of which I would most respectfully.
