The School of Law acknowledges with appreciation the generous gifts of donors which provide the following loan funds and scholarship grants to deserving students.

LOAN FUNDS

ALVIN R. AND ALETHA FAYE ALLISON LOAN FUND--Fund to provide short-term loans to law students in need of financial assistance, endowed by Mr. and Mrs. Allison of Levelland.

JUDGE DAN BLAIR LOAN FUND--Funds available to students for short-term loans in the name of Judge Blair who served as District Judge for Lubbock, Hockley, Cochran, and Crosby counties, 1936-1951.

CHILDRESS COUNTY FUND--Fund to aid students from Childress County with sums received by attorneys for representing indigents in that county.

HUNT, RASCHKE, ROBISON AND WEINSTEN LOAN FUND--Fund established by the Student Bar Association in honor of the winning team and coach of the 1979 National Moot Court Competition.

DREW SIMPSON MEMORIAL FUND--Fund to aid students in financial difficulty, established by the family, colleagues, and friends of Drew Simpson ('74) on his death in February 1972.

E. WAYNE THODE MEMORIAL LOAN FUND--Fund established by students, colleagues, and friends of E. Wayne Thode, a visiting professor during Fall 1979 from the University of Utah, for his contribution to and interest in quality legal education.

ORDER OF BARRISTERS--Trophies and certificates from the law firm of Carr, Evans, Fouts & Hunt to students selected as members of the national Order of Barristers for having exhibited excellence and attained high honors through the art of courtroom advocacy.

SCRIBES AWARD--Two-year honorary membership in Scribes, The American Society of Writers on Legal Subjects to the Law Review graduating senior who has demonstrated an ability to do outstanding legal writing and editing.

C.J.S. AWARDS--Selected titles of Corpus Juris Secundum from West Publishing Company to the first, second, and third year students selected by the faculty for significant contribution toward overall legal scholarship rather than top grades in the class or in any particular course.

JUDGE MEADE F. GRIFFIN AWARD--Cash award from Judge Griffin's former briefing attorneys to the graduating law student who, through industry, perseverance, integrity, and character, has best utilized the law school experience to improve and prepare for service to the profession and to mankind.

OUTSTANDING PROFESSOR OF THE YEAR--Certificate and inscription of name on a permanently displayed plaque to the faculty member voted by the student body as the outstanding professor in an election conducted by the Phi Alpha Delta Law Fraternity.

GEORGE W. AND SARAH H. DUPREE AWARD--Cash award and inscription of name on a permanently displayed plaque to the member of the graduating class who, in the opinion of the student's colleagues, best exemplifies the ability desired in one soon to join the legal profession.
