Sir,

Herewith I transmit duplicate invoices of goods which have been purchased for the Creeks under the 3<sup>d</sup> article of the Treaty of 1838 and for the Osages, under the 2<sup>d</sup> article of the Treaty of 1839, and have been shipped to the address of Maj. Isaac Clark, Quarter Master at New Orleans, who was requested to forward them to you at Fort Gibson by the earliest opportunity. You will please to receive and receipt for them, and see that they are properly delivered to the Indians. Whatever expense you may have to incur, on account of freight &c, will be met out of the funds which will soon be remitted to you "for transportation & incidental expenses."

The remarks, which were made last year with respect to the goods then purchased, apply in the present instance, and it is hoped the articles will prove satisfactory to the Indians. The balances of the sums set apart by the treaties for this object will be remitted in money with the Cash Annuities, viz: \$7,583<sup>50</sup>/<sub>100</sub> for the Creeks, and \$55<sup>58</sup>/<sub>100</sub> for the Osages.
