Sir: I have the honor herewith to enclose you application for renewal of license by Charles J. Wright of with license signed by myself pro forma - to be disposed of according to existing regulations.

I cannot conceive that it could be the intention of the Department to inflict so great an injury upon old traders, or to allow them to go in - Victing thousands of dollars in goods for the Indian Trade, with the determination to refuse their applications for renewal of license - allowing them no notice of their danger -

The application in my absence ought to have been made to you, but as the bond is executed & all the formalities completed, I suppose it will save you trouble to sign & enclose the papers to be acted upon as if an original application.
