

Office Capt. Indian Affairs
 San Bernardino. Aug 31. 1855.

Sir,

I was advised by my predecessor
 C. W. Johnson, that a parcel of Creek goods, which
 had been sunk on some boat on this River, on their
 way up, was in store at this place, and from the
 character of the articles, (not from the abuse by selling)
 the Indians declined receiving them - All of which
 I advised the Comr Ind Affs, immediately and
 he now sends his reply to me of the 16th July last, in
 which he desires it best for me to instruct you
 to inform the Creek Indians and in store at this
 place for their use, and ready for delivery, and
 if they desire to receive them, I will cause the
 goods to be forwarded to, and distributed by you.

Among the articles are several box wheel heads
 and as I have no bill of the goods cannot say
 how much articles besides.

Please respond at an early
 period as the object now is to clear up the
 all concerns. Great respect fully
