Creek Nation } This day personally  
appeared before me James Logan, United  
States Agent for the Creek Tribe of Indians  
Daniel G. Gigg, who after being duly sworn  
deposeth and sayeth as follows. To Wit—  
That on the fourth day of July 1840 a  
party of Indians, headed by some of the  
Chiefs of the Creek Nation came to the  
Pen of Mackey Banks & Co, situated at  
the Depot upon the North Fork of the  
Canadian in said Nation, and took  
therefrom Three Hundred and Fifty one  
head of Cattle, forcibly. That he was in  
the employ of the said Mackey Banks & Co  
at the aforesaid time, was present and saw  
the Indians drive the Cattle off & that they  
did so without the authority of any person  
authorised to issue said Cattle to them, and  
further said Deponent saith not
